

Mission Statement

OMA exists to glorify God by providing excellent music instruction in a Christian community for students in Middle Tennessee. We seek to support students reaching their God-given potential as musicians.

In addition to offering music instruction, our intent is to develop a supportive community for our musicians and their families.

What's in our name?

The word "overture" was chosen to describe the intent behind everything we do. By both connotation and definition, it embodies "an introduction to something more substantial." We aim to share our passion for excellence in musicianship with each student; we aim to see the next generation of musicians develop from the beginning a deeper understanding of music while simultaneously learning that all of life should be aimed at glorifying God, the Creator, including stewarding their gifts and talents; we aim to foster in our student community a love for music that will last their whole lives.

What are we passionate about?

We want our students to understand that music is much more than notes on a page; that it is a vehicle for expressing the breadth of human emotion, the language of the soul, and the beauty of God as part of His created order. We want to facilitate collaborative opportunities through which students and the community can encounter the beauty of God's created order, both its expansiveness and its deeply personal facets, through the musical arts. We want to follow in the footsteps of those who have gone before us to teach that music shall be "soli Deo gloria" -- for the glory of God alone.

Student Behavior and Conduct

God has created each of us in His own image; we owe every action and thought to His goodness in creating and preserving us. Following Christ's example, we have a duty to love and honor Him by respecting the persons and world that He made and loves. Jesus Christ, as very God and Savior, is our example. Our conduct should be modeled upon His conduct, demonstrating humility, self-sacrifice, love, and joy.

"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." Ephesians 2:10

Relationships in Community

God has placed us in relationship with the other human beings in our communities, all of whom were created in His image. We ought to love our brothers and sisters in holy friendship, stirring them up to love and good works in Christ Jesus. We owe the adults in authority over us within the community cheerful obedience in acknowledgment of their experience and wisdom. We owe the adults not in authority over us in the community the duty of respect.

Overture Music Academy is a community of families from diverse backgrounds. All students shall be welcomed and supported equally at OMA. We expect and encourage our students and their parents to develop wholesome and healthy relationships with each other and to help build the sense of Christian community by following these guidelines:

- Make every effort to include others.
- Be an accepting, supportive friend to all students at OMA. Do not gossip about others. Guard your tongue and actions both in and out of class.
- Be a humble peacemaker. If a problem arises with someone, always talk to that person first in an effort to resolve the conflict before discussing the problem with anyone else.
- Focus attention on building solid friendships, not romantic relationships.
- Maintain healthy friendships with everyone. PDA (public displays of affection) is prohibited
 while attending OMA classes, rehearsals, or performances, or while students are in the process
 of arriving or departing from the above.
- Respect and encourage peers, mentors, and parents with words and attitude.
- Provoke others to love and good deeds.

Communication

Students and parents will receive regular messages with announcements, reminders, and practice guidance. Please make sure you and your student are reading this e-communication, and please feel free to contact directors or tutors if you have any questions. E-mail and Google Classroom are considered our official and main means of communicating pertinent class information to you outside of class time. All students (and parents) are expected to weekly check their e-mail and Google Classroom for important communication. It is also your responsibility to check spam filters. Ongoing participation in the learning management system (Google Classroom) is required of students at Overture Music Academy. OMA uses the one-way "Remind" text-based announcement system for only emergent and occasional announcements such as inclement weather. At least one parent in the family will need to be able to receive these messages on a cell phone.

Digital Citizenship and Technology Use

OMA Students are expected to demonstrate digital citizenship at all times. In other words, they are to behave responsibly online, no matter where they are or what device they are using. Students that participate in online bullying, harassing, indecent, or inappropriate behavior outside Overture Music Academy hours may be disciplined by the OMA board if their behavior is harmful to or reflects poorly upon the community of OMA individuals or families.

Students should recognize they are creating a digital footprint that will remain with them beyond their school experience and could have potentially permanent and irreversible results. Students of Overture Music Academy have the right to free speech insofar as they are abiding by the behavioral expectations of OMA. Whether interacting in person, in writing, or in electronic form, students will not be protected if their speech brings embarrassment or shame to themselves or the program, or if their speech negatively impacts the reputation of the student or the program.

Examples of non-protected speech include:

- any illegal activity;
- any activity that is lewd, vulgar, obscene, indecent, or that portrays any conduct done in a manner whereby the community learns of such activity;
- or any activity that degrades, demeans, or disparages any tutor, staff member, parent, or student.

Furthermore, use of technology or phones during class or at any point during a student's day at OMA should be limited to appropriate communication, homework, and G-rated material. Students will not be permitted to use video games while at OMA. If using a computer or iPad/Tablet at Overture, students will be asked that the device screen faces the center of the room so as to be visible by everyone in the room. Insofar as it is possible, this approach shall be honored with regard to personal phone screens as well.

During rehearsal and class, devices should be kept silent and in a backpack unless otherwise instructed by the teacher for a special purpose like tuning.

The Overture Music Academy Board of Directors reserves the right to discipline any student that violates the above categories of non-protected speech or infractions of responsible digital citizenship.

Dress Code

Overture Music Academy staff, directors, and students are guests at our host site. Our appearances should always be modest and considerate of our hosts, our visitors, and each other. Infractions of the dress code will be addressed by the tutors, staff, or ensemble directors, or by the OMA Board of Directors, as needed. If there is a Dress Code issue, parents may be called to bring a change of clothing for the student. This applies to regular OMA rehearsal days as well as special events.

Our dress code allows for personal expression within these guidelines:

- Dress comfortably and with your individual fashion personality reasonably intact.
- Hats should be removed during class if they are deemed distracting by the tutor or cover a student's eyes.
- Clothing with inappropriate logos or slogans or any tight or sheer clothing are inappropriate and should not be worn to rehearsals or classes.
- Undergarments should not be visible through tight or thin fabrics. Undergarments should be *under* your garments and not visible. Necklines should cover cleavage; apply the "bending over in front of the mirror" test before coming to class. Male students should remain covered from the waist up at all times.
- Dresses and skirts should extend below your fingertips when your arms are at your sides; opaque leggings or biker shorts must be worn under skirts that do not qualify. Shorts must also come below your fingertips when your arms are at your sides.
- Leggings (and opaque tights) are not considered to be "pants" and may only be worn under appropriate length skirts, shorts, or blouses/t-shirts longer than fingertips when arms are resting at your sides.
- Strapless shirts are not allowed at any time. Midriff shirts are inappropriate and should not be worn to rehearsals or classes. If you stand up straight and hold your arms shoulder high, no skin should be visible at your waist.

This dress code is in effect for all functions and activities of Overture Music Academy including social events such as trips, performances, and including off-location rehearsals, classes, and events.

Respect in Rehearsals and Classes

Students (and their parents) are expected to make every effort to participate actively and positively during rehearsals, classes, and volunteer positions. Each ensemble director, coach, or tutor will provide clear expectations for student's at-home preparation, outlining what needs to be done outside of class or rehearsal time to be prepared for OMA each week.

Students are asked to commit to spending the amount of time preparing for rehearsals suggested by the director each week at home in order to be a committed member of the ensemble.

Parents are asked to support their students in their preparation as well as to encourage them in the pursuit of excellence. This includes, but is not limited to, making certain they have the necessary equipment & tools for success in practicing and performing as well as being certain students are on time or early to all classes and call times.

Respect for my body

Students are expected to abstain from tobacco, electronic cigarettes, alcohol, sex, drugs, and any other illegal activities. Students should keep conversation clean and healthy regarding these topics. Any instances of bullying, fighting, theft, plagiarism, cheating, controlled substance use, or other honor code violations will not be tolerated and may result in probation, suspension, and/or expulsion as determined by the OMA Board of Directors. Controlled substance use on campus (in or outside the building) is grounds for expulsion.

Respect for our host

We all (students, tutors, parents, directors, and visiting guests) have a moral and legal obligation to respect the property and boundaries of our weekly and special event hosts. When we are on site for OMA activities, students are expected to "do unto others as you would have them do unto you" (Matthew 7:12). Students will be involved with the setting up and tearing down of rehearsal and class spaces each week as fits the needs of OMA at our host site. Additionally, we expect everyone associated with OMA to follow these guidelines:

- For security reasons, please enter and exit the building only through the designated door(s).
- If you have muddy shoes, wipe them clean before you come inside.
- Be respectful of the belongings of our host and the furnishings including furniture, classroom materials, pianos, books, plants, etc.
- Students should eat in designated areas only. When the weather allows, students can go outside to eat (make sure an adult is present). Clean up after you finish -- leaving trash behind is disrespectful and will not be tolerated.

Safety Policy

- No students shall be left alone in a private space or closed room in groups of two.
- All participants and their parents/guardians must agree to hold OMA, its officers, leaders, and agents
 harmless from any and all liability or claims which may arise out of or in connection with supervision
 when a parent/guardian is present on premises.
- There shall be at least two unrelated adults (at least two years older than the oldest child participant) present at all events for OMA students.
- No adult should be alone with an unrelated child in a private space or closed room.
- All classes will be visually-open, or will have two adult supervisors.
- Regardless of group size, all events lasting more than 12 hours will have at least three adult chaperones, unless the board gives prior written approval for an exception.
- A door is to remain open when a student and tutor/director of OMA are working together one-on-one (if the door doesn't have a window), or a third person shall be present.
- Overnight programs shall provide safe, supervised sleeping arrangements.

What do we believe?

Our Statement of Faith includes truths upon which orthodox Christians agree. It offers clarification on distinctives that affect the life of students and families learning together in Christian community and mutual support of one another. It concerns the authority of Scripture, Deity of Christ, the Person and Work of Jesus Christ (the Gospel) as revealed in Scripture. It is the faith once delivered to the saints (Jude 1:2, Ephesians 4:5) which distinguishes believers from non-believers.

We believe:

- The Bible to be the divinely inspired, infallible, authoritative, inerrant, written Word of God, the supreme standard for all faith and life (II Timothy 3:16; II Peter 1:21). Therefore, we are to believe and obey its teachings. The Bible is the only source of special revelation for Christian believers today. Faith in Christ alone has always been the only way of salvation.
- There is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In the unity of the Godhead these three "persons" are co-equal, co-eternal, and fully God. (Genesis 1:1; John 10:30, 37-38) God is personal, yet beyond our comprehension. He is an invisible spirit, completely self-sufficient and unbounded by space or time, perfectly holy, just, loving, & merciful.
- God made all things *ex nihilo*, or "out of nothing." **creating the heavens, the earth, and all they contain.** He is sovereign over all things, upholding and governing them in accordance with his eternal will.
- God created all human beings in His image by His direct act. Therefore, we believe that human life is sacred from conception to its natural end; we must honor the physical and spiritual needs of all people. Every person should be treated with love, dignity, and respect. (Genesis 1:26-28; Genesis 5:1,2; Psalm 139:13; Isaiah 49:1; Jeremiah 1:5; Matthew 22:37-39; Romans 12:20-21; Galatians 6:10)
- Because of the sin of Adam, all mankind is corrupt by nature, dead in sin, and subject to the wrath of God. God determined, in His grace, that sinners may receive forgiveness and eternal life through the regeneration of the Holy Spirit leading to faith in Jesus Christ. Salvation is the free gift of God brought to the sinner by grace and received by personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, whose substitutionary death on the cross paid the penalty for man's sin. (Romans 3:19, 23; John 3:16,17; John 5:24; Ephesians 2:8-19; Titus 3:5,6).
- We believe in the death of our Lord Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His vicarious and atoning death through His shed blood on the cross (being fully God and fully man), in His bodily resurrection, and in His imminent bodily return in power and glory. He will return to judge the living and the dead, bringing his people (with glorious, resurrected bodies) into eternal life, and consigning the wicked to eternal punishment. (Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:23; Luke 1:35; Hebrews 4:15; Hebrews 7:25; John 2:11; Hebrews 9:12; Hebrews 1:14; John 11:25; Acts 1:11; Revelation 19:11-16).
- Man's repentance of sin will produce good works as the fruit of his faith. Believers strive to keep God's moral law, summarized in the Ten Commandments, not to earn salvation but as a response to a loving Savior and a desire to obey Him. God is the Lord of the conscience, so that men are not required to believe or do anything contrary to, or in addition to, the Word of God in matters of faith or worship. The ministry of the Holy Spirit is to convict mankind, indwell, guide, instruct, and empower the believer for godly living and service. (Ephesians 5:18; Ephesians 4:30; I Corinthians 3:16; I Corinthians 6:19, 20).
- We believe God's plan for human sexuality is to be expressed only within the context of marriage. We believe that God created man and woman as unique biological persons made to complement each other in marriage if God wills. God instituted monogamous marriage between male and female as the foundation of the family and the basic structure of human society. For this reason, we believe that marriage is exclusively the union of one male and one female. (Genesis 2:24; Matthew 19:5-6; Mark 10:6-9; Romans 1:26-27; 1 Corinthians 6:9).
